FOSTER CARE & SIBLING BILL OF RIGHTS

The SaySo Board of Directors has formerly endorsed a **Foster Care and Sibling Bill of Rights**. We will be advocating for this to be passed into legislation by the North Carolina General Assembly. There are many parts to both documents that were written by young people in foster care on behalf of other youth in substitute care. These (2) Bill of Rights are examples of SaySo's mission to work to improve the substitute care system by educating the community, speaking out about needed changes, and providing support to youth who are or have been in substitute care.
